
Ceramics Art Portfolio By NAME REDACTED

For this project, I wanted to create something that was worthwhile and that I would use all the time. I also wanted to learn how to better use my clay so that I can make better things in the future.




Day 1:

To create this artwork I used clay coils to make my wells and walls. Then I smoothed them over to make it look more subtle. Some things that I incorporated in my art is the details/indents on the side of the shell to make it look more shell like. I did not add any texture because I thought that would ruin the look of it and I thought it was more beautiful with it more simple. However, in my water cup has texture in the middle to give it a ocean vibe. I made the cup wavy as well to make it look like a clam with the pearl in the middle.
